### Peru: Between the Amazon and Andes



#### Day 1, Mon, 11.05.2026: Flight to Peru

Individual arrival in Lima (flights not included in this Marco Polo tour). After your arrival at the airport, transfer to your hotel in Lima. In the late afternoon, your Marco Polo Scout welcomes you and takes you on a tour of Miraflores. For dinner, your guide has reserved a table at a local restaurant - a perfect opportunity to dive straight into Peru's delicious cuisine. The meal is intentionally not included, so you're free to order whatever you like.

#### Day 2, Tue, 12.05.2026: Lima

Together, we take a bus tour of Lima: We begin by exploring the colonial history of the Old Town and the eerie catacombs of San Francisco. After a stroll through the Bohemian art district of Barranco, we round off the day with a lunch showcasing the fascinating creativity of Peruvian cuisine. The rest of the day is free. B/L

#### Day 3, Wed, 13.05.2026: Lima - Amazonia

Morning flight over the Andes to Puerto Maldonado. You touch down in another world: seemingly endless jungle interspersed with milky brown rivers – get ready for adventure in the Amazon lowlands. After quickly dropping off our bulky luggage, we board a boat and head for the rustic jungle lodge. In the afternoon, our local Scout takes us on our first hike through the jungle. B/D

# Days 4-5, Thu-Fri, 14.-15.05.2026: Amazon rainforest

Two days of pure jungle adventure! During our hikes, families of monkeys swing through the treetops as we walk by. With a bit of luck, you can spot turtles, caimans, giant otters, and tapirs in the dense jungle from the boat. On Monkey Island, we keep an eye out for capuchin, lion, and squirrel monkeys. From an observation tower, you can gaze out over the sprawling jungle. Toucans, macaws and birds of prey circle above the treetops and moriche palms. B/I /D

# Day 6, Sat, 16.05.2026: Amazonia - Sacred Valley

In the morning, we return to Puerto Maldonado by boat, and in just under an hour's flight, we find ourselves back in the Andes: Cusco (3400 m). You can enjoy your first panoramic view of the Inca capital from the Sacsayhuamán fortress, then our bus takes the turn-off into the lower-lying Sacred Valley. Two nights in the Urubamba Valley (2860 m). B

# Day 7, Sun, 17.05.2026: Machu Picchu

As the tracks narrow, adventure approaches. On board the Vistadome panoramic train, you travel through the Urubamba Valley towards Huayna Picchu, the legendary sugar loaf mountain of the Cordillera. Amid dramatic natural surroundings lies Machu Picchu, the lost city of the Incas, which was only rediscovered in 1911. Temples, granaries, houses, and the Intihuatana: "The Hitching Post of the Sun". Prepare yourself to be amazed! Return by train in the late afternoon. B

# Day 8, Mon, 18.05.2026: Sacred Valley - Cusco

Yesterday we covered the theory, today we put it into practice: Off to the **Inca workshop**!



"Ama sua, ama llulla, ama quella" - the moral code of the Incas in Quechua: "Do not steal, do not lie, do not be lazy!" With this in mind, we

roll up our sleeves and get to work: We try our hand at quipu knotting and learn about the knot writing system used by the Incas for accounting. And then we get down to business: compacting earth, shaping adobe bricks and lining them up to dry! Sharing a laugh with the locals is just as much a part of the experience as enjoying a beer or two.

One more stroll through Pisac, then it's time to leave the countryside behind and head for the city of Cusco. B

#### Day 9, Tue, 19.05.2026: Cusco

Explore Cusco and see what remains of the Inca civilisation. Some of the stonework was actually done by the Spanish. We wander from Coricancha – the Temple of the Sun – between Inca walls to the Plaza de Armas and the cathedral. In the church, we see works typical of the famous Escuela Cusquena, which blends European painting styles with indigenous motifs: In one depiction of the Last Supper, the people are eating guinea pig and drinking chicha! The rest of the day is yours to spend at your leisure. B

#### Day 10, Wed, 20.05.2026: Cusco - Puno

Off to Lake Titicaca: Today, our coach takes us through the fertile Vilcanota Valley to the Baroque church in Andahuaylillas and the impressive Raqchí Inca Ruins. We cross the 4,350-metre-high La Raya Pass, and afterwards our coach rolls through lonely high mountain land-scapes, with only a few small villages scattered here and there where local women farmers sell Andean cheese by the roadside. In Puno, we reach Lake Titicaca. B/L

### Day 11, Thu, 21.05.2026: Lake Titicaca

By boat, we head out onto the steel-blue lake, first to the **floating islands** of the Urus and then on to Isla Taquile – the island of knitting men. Your Scout will tell you why the men here wield knitting needles and what the colours of the typical knitted hats say about the lives of the inhabitants. A stroll across Puno's main square and the climb up to a viewpoint are rewarded with a fantastic panoramic view of the lake. B/L

#### Day 12, Fri, 22.05.2026: Lima

After a stopover at the mysterious burial towers of Sillustani, we drive to Juliaca in the morning and fly from there to Lima. We have enough time to buy some last-minute souvenirs and say goodbye to Peru. B

### Day 13, Sat, 23.05.2026: Return flight

Individual return flight from Lima (flights not included in this Marco Polo tour). B
