## South India: Teatime between the seas



Day 1, Thu, 12.02.2026: Europe meets India Upon arrival in the morning, you are welcomed and taken directly to breakfast. After check-in, a short city tour of Chennai follows. At the Madras Museum, we admire bronzes from the Chola period. But India's second oldest museum has plenty of other treasures to discover. D

# Day 2, Fri, 13.02.2026: A treasure trove of archaeology

Our day begins with a visit to the Santhome Cathedral, which houses the remains of Thomas the Apostle. Afterwards, we continue past the famous Marina Beach, one of Chennai's best-known landmarks, which stretches for 13 kilometres. The route continues past the flower and fruit market, before we stop to visit the impressive Kapaleeshwarar Temple. From there, the journey continues to Mahabalipuram (60 km). B/D

# Day 3, Sat, 14.02.2026: Tropical temple in Mahabalipuram

A visit to the fishermen in Devaneri. Camera charged? Between the surreal rock formations and dreamy Mahabalipuram Beach, we literally have a million photo opportunities. On a tour of the city, we discover impressive cave temples and elaborate relief sculptures. These structures, built in the 7th and 8th centuries in the Dravidian style, are mostly dedicated to Vishnu or Shiva. Among the highlights are the famous Shore Temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Arjuna's Penance, the Five Rathas, and several Mandapams. The sculptures here tell stories of deities, animals, Hindu legends and everyday life. B/D

Day 4, Sat, 15.02.2026: Utopia in Auroville We continue towards the southernmost tip of India – shortly before Puducherry, we stop at the Sri Aurobindo Ashram. After a brief visit to the city museum of the former French colony, we make a pit stop to admire the new age world of Auroville (110 km). B/D

Day 5, Mon, 16.02.2026: Shiva's celestial dance Palm trees, sugar cane and small villages line our route to Tanjore on the Kaveri plain. On the way, we stop in Tharangambadi. Want to hear some Indian music? Your Scout has a wide selection to choose from. Shiva also has a sense of rhythm: A temple was dedicated to him in Chidambaram as Nataraja, the King of Dance. Another architectural gem of the Chola kings: the Airavatesvara Temple in Darasuram (UNESCO World Heritage Site) (175 km). B/D

Day 6, Tue, 17.02.2026 Temples and god makers The Brihadishvara Temple in Tanjore (UNESCO World Heritage Site) is a whopping 1,000 years old. In Vaitheeshwaran Koyil, fortune tellers can see what your future holds by reading your personal palm leaf. Excursion to Madurai (235 km). At the Meenakshi Temple in Madurai, we witness a pious and lively ceremony in the evening. B/D

# Day 7, Wed, 18.02.2026: In the heart of Tamil Nadu

We visit Sri Meenakshi Sundareshwarar Temple, one of India's largest temples and the lifeline of the city of Madurai. Another architectural highlight: Thirumalai Nayakkar Palace. With all that sightseeing, it's time to satisfy your appetite. Explore the city's diverse cuisine and discover how closely culinary art, history and culture are intertwined here. B/L/D

Day 8, Thu, 19.02.2026: A bouquet of aromas Everything is so green! Lush landscapes and "spicy" mountains escort you over the heights of the Cardamom Hills on a spectacular drive to Thekkady (150 km). In a spice garden, we get tips from the spice masters on how to grow pepper and ginger. In the evening, we get to know the distinctive culture of South India during a demon-

stration of the traditional martial art of Karalipayattu. B/L/D

Day 9, Fri, 20.02.2026: Tigers, tea and teak The morning begins with a leisurely stroll through the tropical landscape where there are plenty of opportunities to become acquainted with the local flora and fauna. Spend the day at your leisure exploring this spice paradise. B/D

Day 10, Sat, 21.02.2026: Behind the tea hills "God's Own Country" is Kerala's tourism slogan. It's certainly not an overstatement with all these natural splendours! (140 km) You reach the backwaters, the river and canal system of Vembanad Lake, where an air-conditioned, traditional wooden houseboat is ready and waiting – this will be your means of transport and accommodation today. Enjoy a taste of Kerala's culinary specialities during the boat ride. B/L/D

Day 11, Sat, 22.02.2026: Tradition in Kumbalangi After so many culinary highlights, you are no doubt particularly interested in where the many different ingredients come from. During a visit to an Indian village, we learn about the sophisticated techniques used to harvest mussel meat, crab, and coconut leaves. You can enjoy some freshly caught fish before the journey continues to Kochi (60 km). B/L/D

# Day 12, Mon, 23.02.2026: In the kingdom of spices

Multiculturalism in the 16th century: Colonial churches, synagogues, spice warehouses and a Chinese fishing harbour – in the old town of Kochi, we follow our guide in the footsteps of adventurers from all over the world. During our final dinner together, we have one last opportunity to savour the unique cuisine of South India and immerse ourselves in the art of Indian dance drama. Late evening transfer to the airport (rooms are available until 12:00 p.m. the following day). B/D
