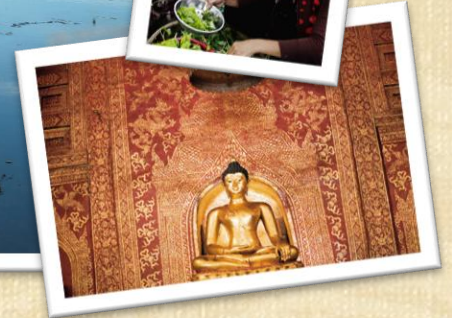

## Day 1, Thu, 21.01.2027: A heavenly welcome, devilishly spicy

A smooth landing in Bangkok in the morning. How do you say "hi" in Thai? We'll learn all that in the coming days from our local Marco Polo scout, who's already waiting for us at the airport with a smile. Our first stop, the hotel: centrally located and surprisingly quiet. Are we really in a metropolis of 12 million? If you don't believe it, just head down the street and you'll be greeted by the everyday buzz. In the early evening, we take the underground to Chinatown. The rattle of tuk-tuks, the gleam of temples and the scent of street food – now we're in Asia! Who likes it hot? Eat like the locals: spicy, in the open, sitting on plastic chairs – and just like that, our Thai dinner is served. Not a bad way to kick off your tour! D

## Day 2, Fri, 22.01.2027: By air, by water and by bike

How do you get around in the City of Angels? First, up in the air! We have breakfast and take the Skytrain to the Chao Phraya, the River of Kings and the city's lifeline – this is where everything and everyone comes together. Then we take the ferry to the Royal Palace, avoiding traffic just like the locals do. After checking out another classic attraction, the Temple of the Emerald Buddha, Noi has two more hidden gems for us to explore: a temple that's as charming as it is popular among Thais and a street market. In the afternoon, we stop briefly at the hotel before really getting started and exploring the city on a bike tour at dusk.



**As night falls, we hop on our bikes. Following our bike guide, we ride through side streets and narrow alleys, right into the heart of the city. And so we cycle into the night – neon signs, temples and night markets all competing for attention. The local stories we hear fascinate us, and a short ferry ride is part of the route. To round things off, another highlight: the Wat Arun in the moonlight. What a night! B**

## Day 3, Sat, 23.01.2027: Angkor Wat up close

New day, new country, new scout: Bye-bye, Bangkok. Transfer to Bangkok airport for the flight to Siem Reap. Arrival in Siem Reap and time for a first look around the city, known as the gateway to the legendary temples of Angkor Wat. B

## Day 4, Sun, 24.01.2027: Jungle bike tour with a picnic

The Jungle Book, but different: Up above, the monkeys howl and down below, we pedal on bikes toward the temples of Angkor Wat – always following our scout. We stop and, for a change, do a bit of climbing – over weathered steps and massive walls. Next Stop. The temple of Ta Prohm is firmly held in the grip of giant strangler figs – the embrace of their roots both splits the walls and holds them together. After our jungle picnic, we stare into faces carved in stone – the Bayon Temple is famous for its enigmatic giant faces. Not enlightened enough yet? Our tip for the evening: a culinary stroll through one of the night markets – perfect for those who love to try new things! B/L

## Day 5, Mon, 25.01.2027: Temple special

Only a few travellers make their way to the temples of Banteay Srei and Beng Mealea – an overgrown, Jungle Book-like setting – despite their UNESCO World Heritage status. On arrival, we're met with silence, wonder, ommmm... B/L

## Day 6, Tue, 26.01.2027: In the heart of the kingdom

After breakfast, we travel by bus to the capital. On the way, we make a stop in Kampong Thom – and we can't go past the Snake-Head Bridge at Kompong Kdei without stopping to take some photos. In the afternoon, we arrive in Phnom Penh. First the must-haves – souvenir hunting in the market hall – then the must-sees: The Wat Phnom is the city's religious centre. Thank you, dear gods, for the safe journey – that's certainly worth a few intricately folded paper lotus blossoms as an offering. They're so pretty, it's almost a shame to offer them up... In the evening, Sisowath Quay is the place to be. We go with the flow – ending up at one of the bars overlooking the Mekong. Right then, cheers! B

## Day 7, Wed, 27.01.2027: One city, many faces

A city tour of contrasts: splendour and poverty, luxury cars and bicycle rickshaws, with the Royal Palace at the centre – golden, majestic, imposing – and all around

it, vibrant everyday life. Later, we board the express boat and head across the Mekong to Vietnam. After four hours, our third scout of the tour joins us: Phong is already waving to us from the pier in Chau Doc. What a welcome – Xin chào! On to the hotel. B

## Day 8, Thu, 28.01.2027: Across the Mekong to Vietnam

The picturesque town of Chau Doc thrives on fish farming and silk production. From Chau Doc, we continue to Can Tho, famous for its floating markets. We'll take a closer look at the huge market square in the city centre. B

## Day 9, Fri, 29.01.2027: Highlights and all the sparkle

In the morning, you hit the ground running: Time to head down the Mekong! At the **Cai Rang** floating market, we dive right into the heart of the action. Here, people haggle loudly, laugh and do business. We continue to Saigon, also known as **Ho Chi Minh City**. But even the locals tend to prefer Saigon, so we'll go with that. Our scout takes us straight on a tour of the city. Among the highlights are Notre-Dame Cathedral, the Reunification Palace and Cholon, Saigon's Chinatown. The journey back to the city centre is as long as the tour was entertaining – but even the traffic jams, bicycles and mopeds are part of the adventure for us. The same goes for our evening plans: a bar, a drink and the city's sparkling lights. B

## Day 10, Sat, 30.01.2027: In the footsteps of the underground fighters

The Cu Chi tunnels are truly unique. During the Vietnam War, they served as a refuge for the guerrillas; today, a former Vietcong leads us through the narrow labyrinth. Fortunately, the tunnels have been widened at key points to accommodate visitors. On all fours, we make our way through the underground passages – a thrilling finale before heading to the seaside. B

## Day 11-12, Sun-Mon, 31.01.-01.02.2027: Action or chillout mode, deluxe style

Life's a beach: Some of us grab a bike or a moped, while others head for the Fairy Stream: Here, we walk barefoot through an ankle-deep stream, flanked by bizarre red sandstone formations that look as if they belong to another world. Those who prefer sand under their feet (or their board) can check out the vast dunes. Whether sandboarding or simply taking in the desert-like scenery right by the sea – it's pure adrenaline. Phan Thiet is a hotspot for kitesurfers and windsurfers. Whether we take to the waves or relax with a drink in hand watching the pros perform their tricks – excitement or relaxation, the choice is ours! B

## Day 13, Tue, 02.02.2027: Farewell

We enjoy the last hours in paradise before being transferred to Saigon airport during the day. Return flight home from (not included). B
