Day 1, Sat. 19.10.2024; Arrival in Tokyo

Individual arrival in Tokyo (flights not included in this Marco Polo Reisen tour). The day is free for you to spend at your leisure and acclimatise.

Day 2, Sun, 20.10.2024: Tokyo - Osaka

We leave Tokyo for the time being and embark on a two-and-a-half-hour journey on the Shinkansen to Osaka. Welcome to big city life! From the observation deck of the Umeda Sky Building, we get a first impression of the city. We then join in the action – in the high street, it's shop till you drop! You're sure to find a quirky souvenir or two along the way. "Osaka is known for having the best street food in all of Japan," says our guide enthusiastically and shows us where to find the best takoyaki – mmh, delicious! As soon as it gets dark, we move on to the nightlife district of Dotonbori. In one of the many cosy izakayas – Japanese pubs – we raise a toast to our journey with hot sake over dinner. B/D

Day 3, Mon, 21.10.2024: Osaka - Koyasan

We set off early by train through the mountains and take the funicular for the last stretch of the journey. In the afternoon, we visit Mount Kōya, the sacred mountain. Our guide takes us on a tour of the vast, mysterious Okunoin cemetery. Any Japanese Buddhist of standing has at least one lock of hair buried here. Continue to the Garan temple complex. Can our mini group handle the revolving pagoda?



In the evening, we're invited to take part in the monks' meditation session. We'll sleep on futons and tatami mats, learn about Japanese bathing culture in the communal bath (separated by gender), and be woken up by the gong for morning prayers. B/D

Day 4, Tue, 22.10.2024: Koyasan - Nara - Kyoto

Breakfast, traditionally vegetarian, is served in your room, kneeling at low tables and, most importantly, accompanied by Japanese tea. We say "goodbye" to the spiritual heart of Japan and continue by bus to Nara. We visit the gigantic Todai Temple with its enormous bronze Buddha inside and it takes our breath away. Who can fit through the legendary opening the size of Buddha's nostril? The reward for this feat is eternal enlightenment. In the afternoon, we continue by bus to Kyoto, the former imperial city and cultural metropolis. Fancy a stroll through the geisha neighbourhood of Gion later on? B

Day 5, Wed, 23.10.2024: Kyoto

Temple hopping in Kyoto. We start with the most well-known site, the Golden Pavilion, which shines majestically from the gardens. We then enter a world of sand and stones: Ryōan-ji Temple is home to one of Japan's most famous rock gardens. Next, we head to Tenryū-ji Temple in Arashiyama. On a walk through the beautifully landscaped garden, we discover streams, small hills, and trees in a variety of colours. Kyoto's bamboo forest is also located in the area. We walk through an emerald green tunnel as the sunlight filters through the trees. There's really something magical about the way the light shimmers on the forest floor! B

Day 6, Thu, 24.10.2024: Kyoto

Today we visit Nijo Castle. At Nishiki Market, we sample local delicacies. The afternoon is free for you to spend at your leisure. B

Day 7, Fri, 25.10.2024: Kyoto - Tokyo

Our programme today begins with the Heian Shrine and the Imperial Palace. Afterwards, we indulge our taste buds as we learn the rules of Japanese sushi making at a local restaurant. Reinvigorated, we take the Shinkansen to Tokyo. We arrive at the hotel in Tokyo in the afternoon. In the evening, we take the opportunity to explore the open-minded neighbourhood of Shinjuku Ni-chōme, Tokyo's largest gay district, accompanied by a local guide (English-speaking). B/L

Day 8, Sat, 26.10.2024: Tokyo

Get ready for the Tour de Tokyo. We can only scratch the surface of what this megacity has to offer. Our first adventure: riding the subway. Will we really be packed into the trains like sardines? We start in Asakusa where a visit to the beautiful Senso-ii is an

absolute must. A practical secondary benefit: the street leading to the shrine is the souvenir mile par excellence, with kimonos and fans on sale at every corner. Caution – many things sold here are "made in China". From the giant Tokyo Skytree television tower, we have a breathtaking view over the mega metropolis. Afterwards, we visit the National Museum in Ueno where everyone is free to stay as long as they'd like B

Day 9, Sun, 27.10.2024: Tokyo

In Harajuku, we visit the famous Meiji Shrine and then dive into Japan's pop culture: teenagers in manga costumes and crazy fashion boutiques on Takeshitadori. We won't find any cats in Cat Street in Shibuya, but we will find lots of unique shops, second-hand stores, and cafés. Your VIP box seat at Starbucks on the corner is the best location for a photo of Shibuya Crossing, probably the busiest intersection in the world. The afternoon is free for you to spend at your leisure – with a few tips from your guide, of course. In the evening, we'll have a farewell dinner together at a local restaurant B/D

Day 10, Mon, 28.10.2024: Return flight from Tokyo Sayonara, Japan! The express bus takes us to the airport. Individual return flight (flights not included in this Marco Polo Reisen tour). B

On the road in Japan

On this tour, we'll be using public transport. This means that for most of the trip, you'll have to carry your own luggage the short distance from the station to the hotel. About the accommodation: the lodgings on this tour range from typical mid-range Japanese hotels with relatively small single rooms to an overnight stay in a temple. Here you'll sleep on futon beds on tatami mats. Demand currently exceeds hotel supply in Japan, which means that longer journeys to the city centre may be unavoidable.
