Instead of by camel, you'll travel by off-road vehicle or on foot with your trekking boots. You'll experience everyday nomadic life and the highlights of the Gobi, travelling from the desert to the eternal ice and from the capital city to the cradle of Mongolia. Explore nature in its rawest form – for true adventurers only.

# Mongolia: Adventures in the Gobi

#### Day 1, Sat, 20.07.2024: City in the steppe

You'll arrive in the capital city in the morning. After breakfast at the hotel, you'll follow your curiosity into the city centre, which has truly blossomed in recent years. Modern technology is just as much a part of everyday life as are the yurts between the tower blocks. The legendary Genghis Khan of course towers over monumental Sukhbaatar Square. For the best view, you'll climb 300 steps to the Zaisan Memorial where you can look out over the city – and into the remote hinterland. You'll take in the sights of the city and then delve into Mongolian culture at the Winter Palace of the Bogd Khan. Over dinner, you'll go through the itinerary of your tour with your guide and make a toast to your adventure.

#### Day 2, Sun, 21.07.2024: How to yurt

In the morning, our smiling drivers will be waiting outside the hotel for us with four-wheel-drive minibuses "made in Russia". After stowing your luggage, you'll set off into the open country - 130 kilometres to our first yurt camp. Most of the ride is on paved roads, but don't get used to it - things will change! Once you've arrived, you'll receive some advice on yurt etiquette from your Marco Polo guide: never step on the threshold, and always put your right foot first! It's surprisingly cosy in here, with real furniture and beds. Nevertheless, adventure trumps comfort here: the bathroom is shared, the toilet is in an outhouse, the water is heated over a fire and - get ready for the shock - there's no internet! Traditionally, dinner starts with "white foods" made using milk, followed by meat and other specialities.

#### Day 3, Mon, 22.07.2024: Photo trekking

Have a cup of steaming tea and some breakfast with your trekking boots on. With your Marco Polo guide, you'll hike through the **Ikh Nart Nature Reserve** on a photo quest for argali wild sheep that can weigh up to 200 kg, Siberian ibex, and steppe foxes. You'll spend another night at the camp.

# Day 4, Tue, 23.7.2024: Bonsai mountains and mountain wildlife bingo

Get up early and hit the road – 150 kilometres lie ahead of us. Oh, wow... An ovoo: you'll stop at a ceremonial stack of rocks decorated with blue cloths. Circle the mound and lay a rock on top as a kind of deposit to your travel karma account. Today's destination: the massive **granite rock formations** of lkh Gazrin Chuluu with peaks of up to 1,706 metres. This mini mountain range is just as spectacular as its wildlife. Who will be the first to spot vultures, marmots, and other creatures on the hike? Overnight stay in yurt camp II.

### Day 5, Wed, 24.7.2024: Talking cliffs

The caravan keeps moving – to the Middle Gobi. The Tsagaan Suvarga canyon: 10 million years of history at a glance, jagged rock formations in as many colours as the different eras of natural history. On a short hike to Del Mountain, your guide will show you "Gobi graffiti", petroglyphs depicting mammoths, lions and other creatures, figures riding and hunting – just normal everyday life over 2,000 years ago... B/L/D

#### Day 6, Thu, 25.07.2024: Ice-cold beauty

Before we set off into the wild, you'll catch a glimpse of civilisation in the Southern Gobi: Dalanzagdad – a small town in the middle of nowhere. Here you can stock up on supplies before heading into the Gobi Gurvan Saykhan National Park to the Yolyn Am Vulture Gorge: cliffs plunging up to 200 metres into the depths and at the bottom, a small river that disappears into the eternal ice(!).

### Day 7, Fri, 26.07.2024: Singing dunes

The Gobi at its most beautiful: off to the Singing Dunes of Khongoryn Els – 180 km of breathtaking natural beauty! During your visit with a **nomadic family**, you'll not only learn that camels and horses are practically family here, but you'll also learn the true meaning of hospitality. As the sun slowly sets and bathes the dunes in the most magnificent colours, you'll take the best seat in the house to enjoy a magical symphony played by the wind. Sliding down the dune again, you'll find yourself in a somewhat oasis-like setting a few kilometres further on. B/L/D

#### Day 8, Sat, 27.07.2024: Cliffs of fire and fossils

The minibuses continue the bumpy ride towards Bayanzag. The **Flaming Cliffs** have devoted fans

worldwide, and not just among palaeontologists – dinosaur nests, skeletons, and eggs were discovered here a hundred years ago!

#### Day 9, Sun, 28.07.2024: Monastery life in 2024

Goodbye, Gobi! Heading north, you'll continue on a dirt road along the Ongi River to a monastery bearing the same name. Once home to as many as 1,000 monks, the monastery was destroyed under communist rule and many lamas lost their lives. Buddhism reloaded: today, part of the complex is under reconstruction and one temple has been completely rebuilt.

#### Day 10, Mon, 29.07.2024: War and peace

We travel to Karakorum in the Orkhon Valley, which was **Genghis Khan's capital city** and the control centre of his vast empire. A few steps away, peace and quiet returns: Buddhism is brought to you live and in colour at the Erdene Zuu monastery.

#### Day 11, Tue, 30.07.2024: Think global, eat local!

Steppe = boring? Far from it: take a short journey back in time to the 6th to 8th centuries at the Qaidam Museum

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Outside the museum, we land in the middle of every-day nomadic life in 2024: the yurt community combines both the modern and traditional. They could have built houses or done away with hospitality altogether! But instead, there's still airag, milk tea and spirits, in addition to other dairy and meat products that are often combined in milk jugs! If you're an experienced equestrian, chances are you'll have the opportunity to climb into the saddle. After dinner, your hosts will show you what they can do on horseback. Later, you'll marvel at mysterious overtone singing accompanied by the horsehead fiddle.

# Day 12, Wed, 31.07.2024: Last steps in the steppe Did you get a chance to ride? If horses are your thing, then Hustai National Park is the just the right place for you: there are so many **Przewalski's wild horses** here that the chances of spotting them on our steppe hike are extremely high!

#### Day 13, Thu, 01.08.2024: Back to reality

You set off early for the capital, leaving the world of the nomads behind you with a heavy heart. After about 100 kilometres, **Ulaanbaatar** appears in the distance looking like something from another planet. Farewell dinner together in the evening – a toast to a once-in-a-lifetime trip! But who knows? Maybe you'll be back...

#### Day 14, Fri, 02.08.2024: Return home

Time to bid farewell to your guide, the master of yurt etiquette. Today can be spent at your leisure: roaming the city streets, shopping for cashmere or camel hair or perhaps even visiting one of the city's many beer gardens. If you're flying with MIAT Mongolian Airlines, the return journey is in the early afternoon (flight duration approximately 14 hours).
